MEMORANDUM FOR: HQ U.S. AIR FORCE COMMAND POST DUTY OFFICERS (OPERATIONS)

SUBJECT: Procedure to Insure Prompt Dissemination of Any Overt Hostile Act  
by a Foreign Power

1. This memorandum rescinds the memorandum dated 19 Jun 50, on this subject.  
(Reference paragraph 42, Incl to Memorandum for the Air Staff, 24 March 1949, AFCAV  
Subj: Check List of Emergency Air Staff Actions.)

2. In the event information is received that a foreign power may commit,  
or has committed, an overt hostile act which could generate into armed conflict  
involving U. S. forces, the following personnel of the Air Staff are to be noti-

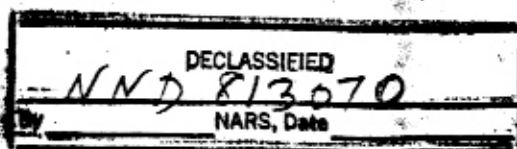

In 6 ROK Div sector, 7 Regt is 6 miles southeast Toktong, 2 Regt 9 miles west Yul, and 19 RCT 6 miles west Yul. CP 24 Inf Div opened vic Oryu. 5 Inf RCT defended north Yul; 21 RCT defended southeast Yul; and 19 RCT defended in Suan area. Elms 19 RCT engaged enemy group 5 miles north Suan. In 1 Cav Div sector, elms 8 Cav secured Koksan, but later rejoined RCT in def psns 3 miles northeast Singye. 7 Cav RCT defended 1 1/2 miles southeast Singye. Elms 5 Cav RCT advd Koksan and established contact with elms 8 Cav RCT, but later rejoined 5 Cav RCT along line from 3 1/2 miles west to 3 miles east-southeast Sokchong. 27 British Commonwealth Brigade enroute Singye. ROK II Corps: 7 ROK Div enroute Sibyon. In 8 ROK Div sector, 16 Regt along east-west line 5 miles northwest Chiha, 10 Regt occupied Chiha, and 21 Regt in Singye. Div to be rel'd by 1st Cav Div, and upon relief will move vic Sibyon. United States X Corps: Evacuation underway Wonsan, supported by ROK units defending. 7 Marine Regt in Changjin Reservoir sector closed Koto, and opened Div CP. 5 Marine Regt vic Changjin mtg hv resistance in southward drive to join other 1st Marine Div trps in Koto area. Buildup of enemy def psns on high ground 3 miles south Koto observed by air. In vic Sudong, enemy ambushed Marine truck column and blocked combat patrol enroute northward. Task Force "D", consisting 1 reinf bn of 3 Inf Div, rept enroute from Majondong to rel elms 1st Marine Regt Sudong. Contd mvmt enemy trps southward in Changjin and Pujon Reservoir areas reptd by air. 26 ROK Regt in area, moving south from Pungsan to Hungnam-Hamhung area, had leading elms at Pukchong. 22 and 23 ROK Regts in def psns Songjin. 3 United States Inf Div, less elms 1st ROK Marines and 17 RCT arrived in Hamhung-Hungnam area. Elms 7 RCT and 1st ROK Marine Regt in blocking psns 12 miles northwest Hamhung; other elms 1st ROK Marines blocking 6 miles southwest Yonpo; and still other elms covering evacuation sups and equip from Wonsan area and possible enemy mvmts vic Posong. Elms 15 RCT blocking and patrolling west and southwest Chigyong.

Navy.

Rochester, English, Lind, and Massey at Hungnam and St Paul, Hank, Sperry and Zellars at Wonsan were on fire support duty. Loading of 3 Inf Div at Wonsan for mvmt to Hungnam contd. Minesweeping Haeju and Hungnam completed. Ceylon, Cayuga, Bataan, and Athabaskan blockading west coast. Theseus and escorts were off Inchon. Acft from TF 77 and Carrier Task Group 96.8 atkd enemy trps, sup facs and mil installations with excellent results. Acft from TF 77 provd close air support for Marines in Changjin area.

6 Dec, FEAF flew 647 eff sorties, including 402 combat, 176 trans, 60 ftr control. 129 armed recon sorties atkd tgts of opportunity in occupied areas including Anju, Chinnampo, Huichon, and Kumhwa. 24 counter air sorties were flown, including 10 sorties on sweep Pyongyang afld and 12 sorties on sweep Sinuiju afld where 20 Yaks strafed. FEAF Bomber Comd dispatched 25 acft to radar bomb Sinanju and Kanggye. FEAF Combat Cargo Comd airlifted 432 pas, 1867 evacuees and 454 tons frt. 7 Dec, FEAF Bomber Comd dispatched 27 acft, 23 visually bombed Yudan, Manpojin, Changjin, and Sachang with good to excellent results. FEAF claims 2 acft on ground, 2 tanks, 27 vehs, 18 railroad cars, 10 sup dumps, and 5 fuel dumps destroyed. Additional info on atk against B-29s reptd yesterday shows enemy atkg above completed overcast for first time. 2 MIGs and 3 B-29s damaged. 2 Airmen wounded. 4 F-80s engaged 2 MIG-15s over Charyongwan on morning 7 Dec. 1 MIG damaged.

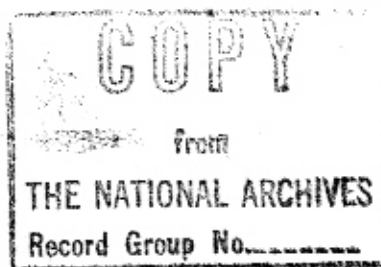
