Following is a letter from Mr Radio Engineer, employed by the Netherlands Cable Factory, Delft, dated 8 September 1952:

The Hague in the Netherlands. The Dutch Cable works are situated in this town and I am working in the Physical Laboratory of this factory.

Last week I was making tests on a V.H.F. antenna which is constructed on top of the roof. (See picture No 1). This antenna is a so called corner reflector, frequency 119.3 Mc/s*

Before this antenna I was making measurements with a field strength meter*. On a certain moment I got the maximum reading of my indication instrument and I took my Zeiss Ikon camera to verify this reading while my assistant Mr Jahren hold the field strength instrument (See picture No 2).

Thereafter I asked him to go downstairs to get a soldering iron.

I went on making tests and at 4:15 C.E.S.T. (3:15 G.M.T.) I loaded the camera to make another picture of the indicator and then I suddenly saw a bright silver light moving at a tremendous speed and coming from my right side, (South direction Rotterdam) It looked like a silver V2 rocket. (We had a rocket launcher just a few miles from our home during the war). There was no sound to hear but when "the thing" came closer it turned towards me and looked like a bright silver round plate. I thought it might be a flying saucer. As I still holded my camera I only pushed the shutter (T 1/250 sec) without looking in the view finder because there was no time to lose. Then I looked at the field strength meter and I noticed a strong dip in the meter deflection of the indicating instrument. The saucer disappeared with a tremendous speed perpendicular to the earth surface. (Time 4:35 C.E.S.T. 3:35 G.M.T.)

I immediately rushed to the Photographic Laboratory where Mreweloped the negative (glass 9 x 12 cm) and we both got the thrill of looking at the first negative of what we thought was a flying saucer.

At home I phoned "The Telegraaf" one of the leading newspapers in the Netherlands and the next day head editor Mr and I went to the Meteorological Institute in the Bilt (near Utrecht). The experts were very excited about this photo. They thought the bright corona around the saucer could be due to ultra violet rays and furthermore deformation because the lens of my camera was fully opened without using the diaphragm. (I had no time to lose. I only tried to make a photo in the shortest possible time)"

Following is a translation of a letter from the Royal Netherlands Meteorological Institute, to Mr dated 1 September 1952:

"It will probably interest you to know which are the results of the measurements on last Thursday. The place where you have photographed the phenomenon is situated 20 degrees south of the east. The center of the disk is situated 20 degrees above the horizon. The diameter is 9 degrees.

When you state that you have only seen the middle part of the disk, the diameter must still be 3 degrees, or 6 times the diameter of the sun. For this reason it is still a great puzzle to me that not a stream of inquiries have reached K.N.M.I., moreover as, on account of the dense traffic on the road between Rotterdam and The Hague, it should have been seen extremely well, because the sun did not interfere. For this reason the phenomenon remains for me a great query mark.

Finally I like to remind you of your promise to give me a list of all persons who did ring you up or wrote to you.

For this I thank you in anticipation.

I also express my thanks for your cooperation during the investigation."

Institute at the Bilt. There, with great speed, a conference was organized of a number of chiefs of sections who were very anxious to put this young "saucer researcher" through his paces.

After a debate of one hour, their conclusion was that this observation had been "very important". As far as is known unique in this country. They would investigate the matter further on the basis of the negative of the photograph of the camera with which the plate was taken.

It was ascertained that the enormous size which the object (or reflection) produced on the photograph must be an optical illusion, as the great beam of light which came from it may have formed a halo on the plate which made it appear so large beyond all proportions.

Another possibility which was suggested at the K.N.M.I. was, that the size on the photograph can be a consequence of the "invisible" (ultra violet) rays, which the eye can not see but which are registered by the photographic plate. The "deviation" of the hand of the measure instruments might be due to an electro-magnetic disturbance or to a magnetic influence of the moving coil galvanometer.


But when the matter of fact question is put "what did really happen?", the scientists keep their mouth shut and then also reason keep silent, and only imagination is let loose.

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
