The Minneapolis Filter Center received the report of this sighting by Mr. [REDACTED] and relayed the information to us at the 31st Air Division. The details of the sighting are reported below:

DESCRIPTION

An object like nothing the observer had seen before. It was cigar shaped. It had no wings. It made no sound. It gave off a high reflection from the sun. It looked like polished aluminum. Object traveled about 30 miles due North during period of observation.

TIME

28/0120Z. Duration of observation was about one (1) minute.

MANNER OF OBSERVATION

Visual.

LOCATION OF OBSERVER

Near Waskish, Minnesota, which is about 30 miles North of Bemidji, Minn.

LOCATION OF OBJECT

Estimated altitude was 10,000 feet.

IDENTIFYING INFORMATION ON OBSERVER

None other than mentioned above.

WEATHER

High scattered clouds at approximately 25,000 feet above terrain. Visibility over 15 miles. Winds at all levels to 30,000 feet, from 290 to 300 degrees, at 10 to 20 knots.


