AIR INTELLIGENCE INFORMATION REPORT FROM (Agency) 4706 DW-5-5 4706 DEFENSE WING

1. One bright, smooth appearing, highly polished silver oval with an estimate ed diameter of 30 feet was observed at estimated altitude of from 500 to 1000 feet and first appeared between two radio towers (WON and WBBM) seven miles from ebservers. At first sighting the object appeared stationary and appeared to be over the towers. During the next 45 minutes the object travelled to the southwest and then back north to approximately its original position. It also moved to some extent in the vertical plane. Its acceleration during these movements was practically instantaneous to a speed which appeared to be much faster than any jet fighter. At times the object moved slowly and during the time it hovered it appeared to rock on its longitudinal axis, When the object rocked or turned into a vertical plane its shape was easily discernable as eval and when in a horisontal plane it appeared to be flat or thin and was difficult to see at this time. At all times during the first 25 to 30 minutes of the observation the object was encircled by a blue circle of light haze. The object was not accompanie by this blue circle of hase for the last 15 - 20 minutes of the observation. The object left no trail or exhaust and made no noise. Its disappearance was described as "like shutting off a light." (See inclosure 1 for diagram of flight path).

- 2. Time of sighting: 1745 to 1830 CDST 29 Jun 45. Length of sighting: forty five (45) minutes.
- 3. Observers were on the flight line at O'Hare Intl. Aprt, Park Ridge, Ill. and observation was made visually without any optical aids.
- 4. O'Hare Int'l Airport, Park Ridge Ill. Objects appeared to be directly overand between two radio towers seven (7) miles west of the field.
 - 5. Observers were: SSG Lopes A/lo Weber A /3c Korkowski (made first sighting)

Above airmen are familiar with jet aircraft and state definitely that this object sighted was not of a type known to them.


6. Weather in direction of the sighting was clear. A slight temperature inwersion at the surface was reported at JOLIET beginning at 1900 CDST. Winds Aloft:

- 7. No known activity or condition could account for the si hting. Scientists at the Adler Planetarium in Chicago who were consulted stated that object could not have been caused by temperature inversion or light refraction and could offer no explan tion.

 - 10. One F-80 was airborne at time of sighting but was not in vicinity.
