On 13 July 1952 at 0300Z I did witness and track an unidentified object on PFI scope No. 2. Target first appeared at 142° and 108 miles. The target painted on the scope only every other sweep and moved approximately 12 miles every time it painted. The target left our scope at 134° at 234 miles. Target was held on our scopes and plotting board for 4 minutes and was cross-told to Prevail. Speed of target was estimated at 1440 MPH. No height was obtainable. There was no visible weather in the area of this target. The object seemed to be on a straight course and made no maneuvering attempts at all. The target painted strong and clear until it left our available range.

At 0320Z on the morning of 13 July 1952 I picked up and tracked an unidentified object on PPI scope No. 2, traveling at a very fast speed, and this target appeared first at 320° azimuth and 128 miles range. The target traveled at an estimated speed of 1600 MPH and appeared about the size of a B-29 or larger. We could obtain no height on this target. The target was on a heading of 211° and did not diminish in size until it left our scopes at 202° azimuth and 255 miles range. The blip appearing on our scopes was of the normal shape of an aircraft but very large and bright. There was no weather showing in the area near this target.
