Dear Mr. Hynek,

Certainly I remember you and our discussions concerning flying objects. More specifically, our discussions concerning the unusual craft that I observed at my ranch in July 1957. It was either the 27th or the 29th of July.

I will relate the details as best as I can recall. I am no artist, but I hope the enclosed sketch will suffice for your purposes. Should you need greater detail perhaps a professional artist could give a better rendering.

In answer to the questions in the third paragraph of your letter: No, I have not come to any further conclusions as to what the craft was. No natural explanation has come to mind, but neither have I come to any unnatural explanation. In short the observation remains unchanged in so far as I can remember. From then until now I have seen nothing that even faintly resembled the craft. Neither have I heard of any person in this acca who has had a similiar experience.

The incident is still quite clear in my mind. I am sure that I saw a craft of a manufactured nature(not a naturally occurring phemomena). The craft made no noticeable sound. It did not make any visible air disturbance(vapor trails, smoke, flame, etc.). At no time did I see any figures resembling living creatures of any type, tho at the time I assumed it to be piloted, probably by members of our Air Force.

At the time of the sighting I was raking hay south of my farm house which is located approximately six miles west of Longmont, Colorado. The time of day was early morning. The sun had barely risen and the countryside was still gold in tone. I observed the craft(object) approaching high in the sky to the SSE. At first I thought that I was about to see a meteor hit the ground. I stared in amazement as the object stopped in midair with a rather abrupt pressure type halt. The craft was then positioned on a line of sight between myself and a promontory to the NNE called "Rabitt Hill". The craft maintained sort of a rocking motion, such as a maple leaf makes while falling. The craft however remained suspeneded where it had stopped.

I stopped the tractor and got off to watch. During the ten minutes or so that I watched the craft I could see nothin else happening.

The craft rose vertically several hundred feet in the air, tilted, and accelerated at a tremendous rate of speed in an arc to the south southwest.

The craft was apparently constructed of a very shiny material which reminded me of blue glacier ice. The top of the craft resembled a honeycomb. The hexagonal compartments partly filled with a bright shiny liquid like substance which made me think of mecury. In spite of the honeycomb appearance the top of the craft appeared to be smooth, as if it were covered with some transparent material such as saran-weap.


Around the midsction was a band like a acalloped wedding band, The scallops were of a darker burnised color, much darker than the rest of the band.


The bottom of the craft was also made of a smooth silver looking metal except for three or four kidney shape designs. These designs were also burnished and appeared darker than the rest of the bottom, but not as dark as the scallops at midsection I could see the bottom of the craft only at such time as it tipped toward me and thus find it rather difficult to sketch.

I estimate the altitude to have been 400 feet above my position, perhaps less. Distance about one-half mile. Diameter estimated 150-200 feet. Vertical one-fifth of diameter.

Second sighting was two weeks or so later. The craft did not stay so long, nor as I remember come so low. It left in the same direction, SSW.

I will look forward to visiting with you on your next trip to Boulder. Also I would be interested in what further information you might have concerning other sightings. Could I be of help in this area in the future?























