

AM on July 31, 1965

At 1:05 Wynnewood police officer, Lewis Sikes, 29, reported an unidentified flying object NE of Wynnewood. At approximately 30-35° at the same time simultaneous radar fixes were obtained by Tinker AFB, Oklahoma City, and Carswell AFB, Forth Worth, Texas.

Officer Sikes observed the object with his wife for approximately 10 minutes ~~in~~ ^{from in} front of their home, then officer Sikes drove across town and observed the object for three more minutes. His wife watched the object until almost 2:30AM.

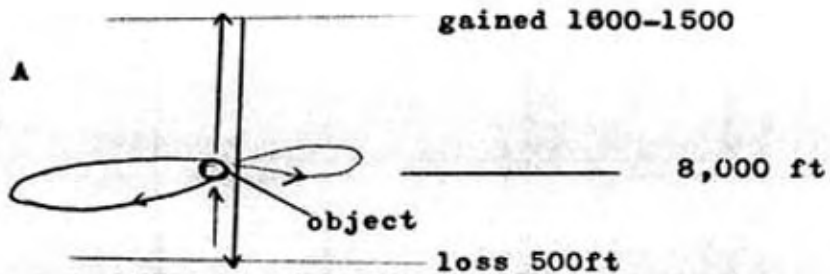
An "intelligent control" was indicated during the first 10 minutes of observation when the object abruptly gained 1000-1500 ft in altitude (estimated by Sikes to be 10,000 ft, confirmed by radar at 8,000ft). The object remained stationary for several minutes and abruptly loss approximately 1500-2,000 ft. The object then moved to the West for approximately 1000-1500ft and returned to the orginal locatēdn. At which time the object movied to the East for approximaltely 1000-1500 ft then returned to its orginal position. (Drawing A)

The night sky was clear and many stars were visible. The object appeared to be about three times as bright as the evening star. The UFO was estimated to be 5 or more miles NE of Officer Sikes and appeared as a "light" source. The object itself was white with a blue-green center, with a red rotating light circling the center (Drawing B).

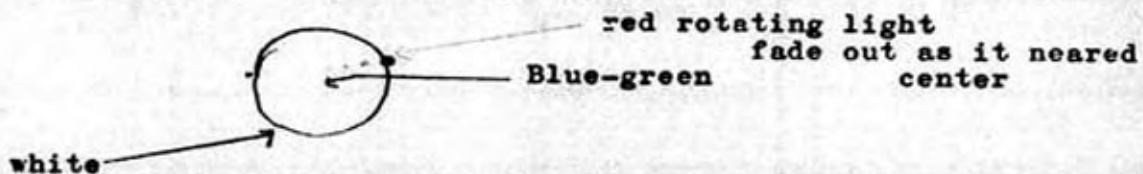
At approximately 1:15 officer Sikes drove across town and once again observed the object at approximately 1:30. His wife reported that the object (while he was gone) seemed to change colors, and shapes and fade out. Both Tinker AFB and Carswell AFB, tracked the object to a point 15 miles southwest of tinker when it disappeared. A few minutes later, it was tracked to a location 29 miles south of Tinker when it was lost again. A Braniff airliner

in the vicinity of Wynnewood at 5,000 ft was notified but the airline pilot said no visual contact with the object was made. Officer Sikes' mother, Mrs Robert Sikes, also watched the object for a short time. She also reported that the object faded out.

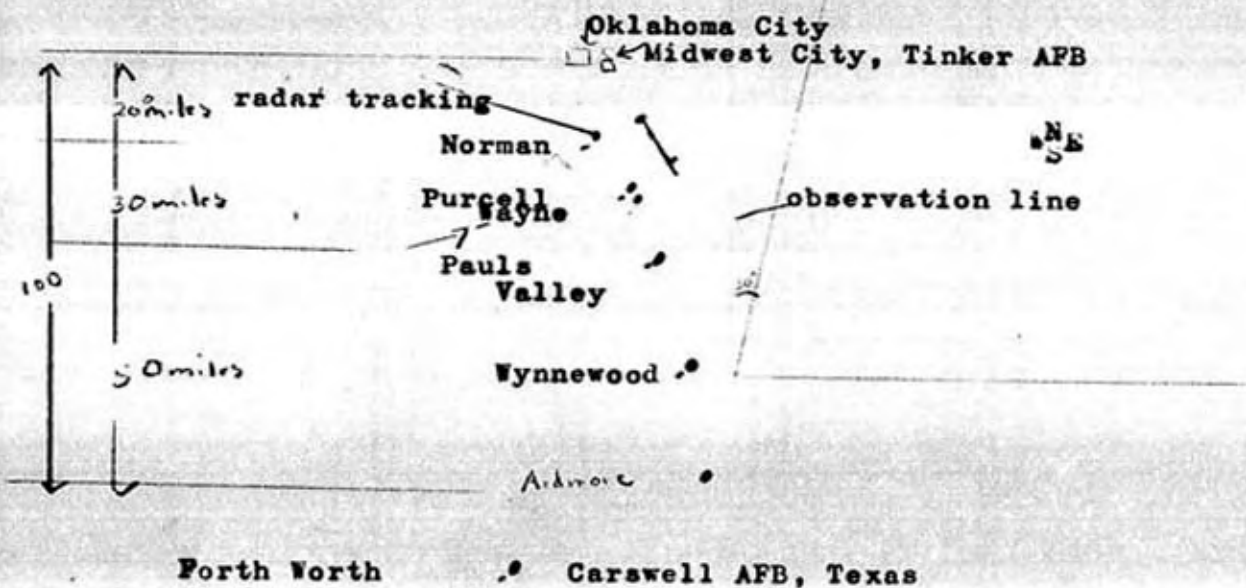

IIOUFO INVESTIGATES

I first learned of the Wynnewood sighting at 9:05 when Mike Buchanan, of KWTW called and wanted to know what all I knew. Within an hour Karon, DeWayne Critchfield and I were on our way. We arrived at the Wynnewood Police station and talked with the chief of police who showed me the first information he had received from officer Sikes in the form of the notation he had observed a U.F.O. and reported it to Tinker AFB. Prior to talking with the chief of police I had called Mrs Robert Sikes' mother of the officer who stated that they had no comment and that a report had been sent to Tinker. The chief of police suggested that we go over to officer Sikes house and talk with him. He gave us directions. When we arrived a reported from Ada, Oklahoma was talking to Officer Sikes wife outside. I introduced myself and was told that Louis Sikes could not be disturbed. I told then I had the official A reporting forms and that all my information would be turned over to you. I was permitted to enter the home and talked for about 2 1/2 hours. While I was there the telephone rang about 10 times. They had received calls from New York, Conn. and Tulsa. While I was there a reported from the Sunday Oklahoman called, when he was told no information we asked if I had been there and I talked with him. He asked me to call him as soon as I returned to Oklahoma City. They wanted NO publicity at all. Officer Sikes did not want to return to work (works the night shift six ~~days~~ nights a week) because everyone would know where he was. He has been with the force for about a year. Before coming to Wynnewood he was a police man in Arozina. They first believed the object to be a aircraft. He has served in the Navy and Army and was shown a UFO film that stated the Navy did not know what the objects were and to report all objects that they might observe. He knew of the Utah and Montana films, but not much about the UFO field in general. At first he would not talk at all. After I told him about the IIOUFO and the recent flap of sightings, my trip to Wright-Patterson AFB, and general information he was most cooperative. I am out of sighting forms so the answers to the 34 questions are as follows.

At 10:30 a John Otto) something like that called. He was representaing KVOO Tulsa, Oklahoma, and they wanted an interview Sunday at 11:30. About 30 minutes before he called Phill Erdberg called and wanted an interview for Monday at 3:00 with photos. He is an AP writer. I have have seven or so reports of UFO's over Oklahoma in the past two weeks. I will send all the information I, have as soon as I get them in order. It appears that this object was also sighted over Oklahoma City on Wednesday July 21, 1965 at Approximately 9:30. Color shaped and manovers are the same. Receivee this report the 28th.

re investigated Sunday afternoon and located a Nettie Marie Thome of Wynnewood who also reported the object. Paults Valley Police did not received any reports.

Oklahoma City IIOUFO August 1 & 2

Information received from the Oklahoma Highway Patrol at the OHP tower Oklahoma City:

Since 8:08 pm the OHP tower received in the neighborhood of 25-30 visual sightings many by police and highway patrol troopers of various UFOs from Purcell area North thru the Norman Area to Chandler and back South through Meeker and Shawnee. (all in Okla) Three Shawnee officers and their Capt have four of the objects in sight at this time, also another has a cropped Y up from the South of Tecumseh and is apparently going to fly directly over Shawnee. The sightings vary from one to four objects, starting, stopping, in a reddish color and varying to a white and blue luster. Shawnee reports the object seem to be flying in a diamond type formation. CUSHING has reported four of the objects, two to the South of Cushing and two to the West flying in a Southerly direction. OHP units 30 and 40 have also made visual sightings. Mrs Bill Tipton 1 1/2 miles West of Davenport on US 66 watched an object which was discribed as reddish on the bottom and white on the top hover for 15 minutes and move off to the West. Tinker AFB 1 to 4 on radar and they advise they are flying very high, approximately 22,000 which seems to coincide with the visual sightings. All very high. TULSA Weather, Visibilty 15 miles. Temp. 76° Wind North MPH. UFOs reported at 9:50 over Guthrie going towards Shawnee. ROBERT Sheriff Department report mult-colored object with legs over Altus AFB. Carl Broadfoot, Liberal Kansas reported seeing a UFO 16 miles East of Forgan at 9:20pm headed in a South East Direction. Highway Patrol said the same object was over GUYMON five minutes later. CHICKASKA reported a UFO over radio station KWCO, Jim Cline, police dispatcher, C.V. Barahill police patrolman, verified the sighting. MOORE UFO going South on Interstate 35, reported by Tice Wagner 1415 Lakecrest, Norman, Oklahoma at 10:00 pm. Mr Allen Smith 4719 S. 29 West, TULSA reported at 10:25 pm, himself and dad sighted a red & blue object west of Tulsa, traveling in a North to South Direction. The UFO was round with a red light that keep going off and on. Est. 8-10,000 ft. Not on radar Tulsa. Police officer watching two green and red things approx. 2 miles South of Sand Springs.

Mr. Jesse Upchurch of Marshall Oklahoma called and advised that from 9:30-9:36 PM. he his wife and two children observed a reddish ball of fire turn to blue than to white, traveling in a westerly direction pretty high. Traveled ^{parallel to} the ground and disappeared out of sight. Appeared as a large house.

LOWTON reported that a former pilot stated he saw one object North of Ft. Sill which was red and blue and silver in color traveling North about 25,000 ft and was not a plane. Ft. Sill could not pick it up on radar. Time Approx: 9:30PM. The residents of the ERICK area report that approx 9:30 PM and elongated object with fire coming from the rear, was very high and traveling fast in a West Direction. The object was brighter than most meteors.

H.C. Neil (newspaper Edmond Oklahoma) and Joe Cobb Edmond police reported at 10:20PM two object West of HARRAH Oklahoma. They were very high and "doing maneuvers". The two UFOs were red-white and blue and were jointed by two red and blue objects. OHP Unit 40 advised the object is over his residence 3 miles South of Lindsay at 10,000 feet has red blinking light in the middle green light on one end blue light on other end and a white light is traveling North over 76 at very fast rate of speed. Sub. Roddy Smith, Smart Motel Hardesty UFO 10 miles East and 10 East Sol Bryans Courner. Object came to a complete stop. Exploded then drifted off in flames. OHP time: 22:20 YOKON Oklahoma. Sub. I then left the OHP tower which is located at Edmond, or 14 miles North of Oklahoma. OHP dispatcher up to 12:00 was a Jim West and Bill Delbert. I went by the OHP District One office and talked with OHP dispatcher Wilber Jones. Then then went to the Oklahoma police station who had called me while I was at the tower and asked if I wanted them to keep a record. I picked up the following information. I got home for the first time at 5:30 by six the phone was ringing I was on the telephone from 6 -11:30 Monday Night 16 hours straight. Was interviewed by all Oklahoma City Radio stations as well as all TV station. KCBS Los Angeles called three times on e was a

25 minute conference called with them, IIOUFO (me) and NICAP Headquarters Washington. Long Island, New York called and took at 25 minute interview for some newspaper. I was up at 6:30 and received calls all day again. Reports and interviews. At 7:00 in the evening Radio and TV station WKY had a Saucer Watch aprty and I was the featured speaker We sighted many Airpoanes but no UFOs. Many of the calls we received reported UFO s that we could identify (since WHY is NW of the city) as airplanes. Over 2,000 persons were there. That was the largest aud. I have talked before. It was over at 10:00 pm. I was home by 1:15 we did have two four inch telescopes. The reports are still coming in. It is now 9:00 Wednesday Moring. The enclosed fragments were received Sunday night from a boy who had received them July 30 from a boy from Texas. A large UFO went over their car and broke up. These fragments hit their car. The boy who ~~gave~~ gave them to me did not know the boy who fould them are just where he found them. We have been unable to locate the boy. There is 2x in my opioion a 99 % chance there is nothing to the story but that 1 % is the reasons I am sending them. We have a lab in Oklahom a City working on it now. (all day yesterday. The fragments are radioactive and highly magnatic.(As you can tell.) It appears they are magnaticite This is the only evidence that has been offered at all. Will send you what the lab hear says. Working on two good leads. If they are true, these are from space.

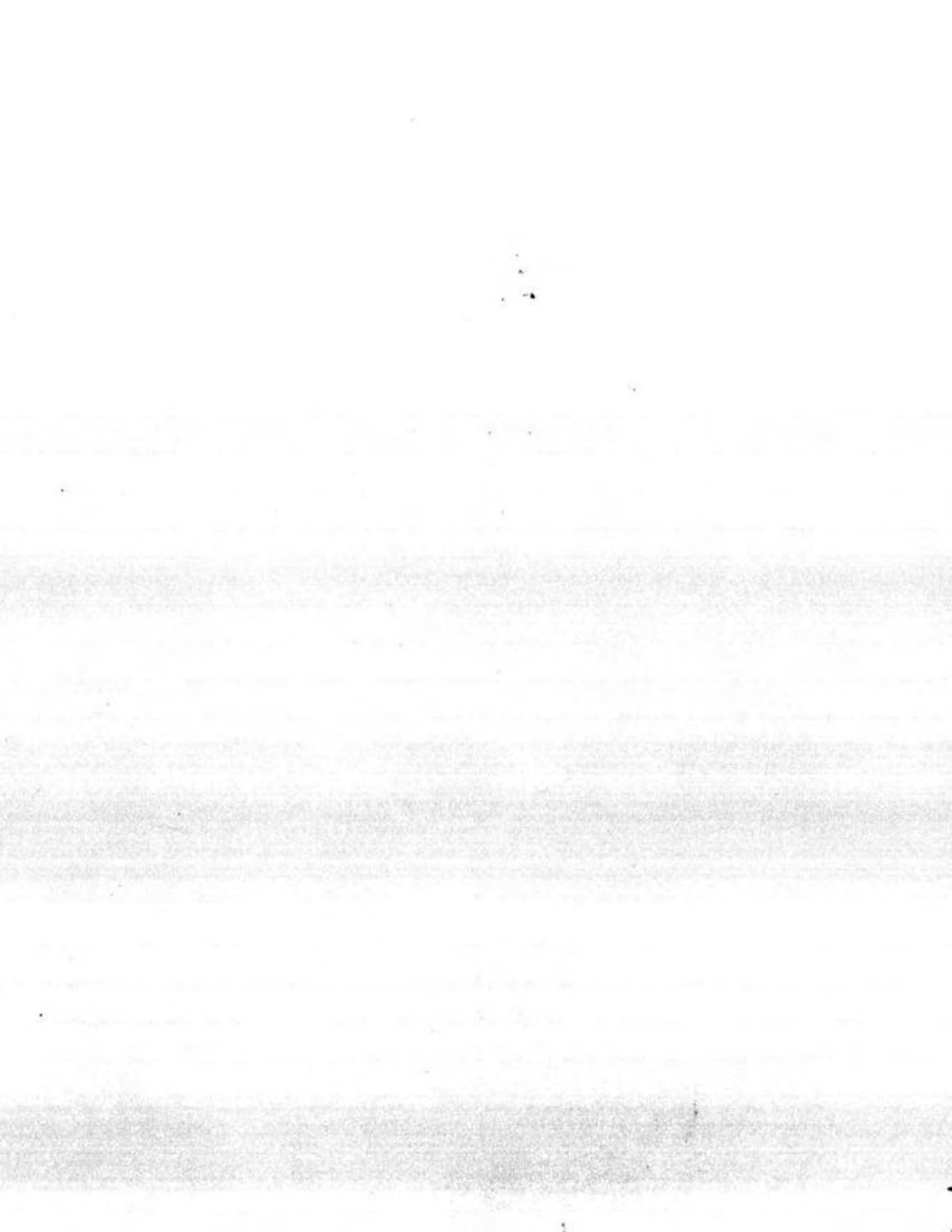

UNIDENTIFIED OBJECT SIGHTED OVER OKLAHOMA

OKLAHOMA CITY, July 31
(AP)—A policeman at Wynnewood, in south central Oklahoma, reported sighting an unidentified flying object early today. Lewis Sikes said he saw the object at 1:30 a.m. and that it appeared to emit a red, blue and white light.

He reported the incident to the Oklahoma Highway Patrol. Tinker Air Force Base at Oklahoma City was advised of the sighting and located the object on radar at about 8000 feet. After checking with other Government installations, Tinker officials said no air traffic was authorized to be in the area.

Carswell Air Force Base at Fort Worth, Tex., also located the object on radar and both Tinker and Carswell tracked the object to a point 15 miles southwest of Tinker at which time it disappeared from both radar scopes. It was picked up again a few minutes later and tracked to a point 20 miles south of Tinker where it again disappeared. It was not relocated.

Enjoyed our telephone conversations. Maybe the enclosed information will be of some help. I realize that most of the information is incomplete but Sunday night was nothing but confusion.


I will send you the Oklahoma Highway Patrol Log of what was reported by their units. It is from my notes enclosed. The news papers give most of the information but not all. For additional information I have enclosed the names and address of the different news medias in the Oklahoma City area that also were interested.

I am beginning to receive mail from our members giving dates and observations. St. Petersburg July 27 & 28 the same objects sighted by many.

We investigated a report of fragments that came from a UFO over Texas. One enclosed. The Oklahoma Civil Defense (Director a friend) made the tests. It was radioactive but due to the soil around it. Will send you the spectrographic analysis. Taped interview with NBC radio news New York. Should be aired this week end.

Will keep you posted. Please let me know any thing you can as soon as possible. I need if possible 100 sightings forms. (for the Oklahoma Highway Patrol and police observations. NOT the fun sighters.)

It is my opinion that many of the sightings in our area are stars and planes but NOT all of them. There maybe 25-50 good fact sightings. The others are all in my opinion sensation seekers.
