



In compliance with Air Force Letter 200-5, dated 29 April 1952, paragraph 7c and 7d, the following report is submitted:

- 1. Object was of crescent shape, resembled a new moan in size and shape. Was not like conventional aircraft.
- 2. Time of sighting was approximately 9 A.M. on the 18th of June 1952.
  - 3. Object was observed visually from the ground.
- 4. The grid co-ordinate at the place of sighting are 89 Degrees 4 minutes west and 43 Degrees 20 minutes North. The nearest known landmark is Columbus, Wisconsin. Object moved North and was at a lever altitude than two Jet aircraft flying in the vicinity.
- 5. There is no knowledge of the observer, consequently his rating will be 6-F.
- 6. Clear skys provailed over the area at the time of mighting. Visibility was at 15 miles. Winds were from the North-Worth-West at 18 miles or hour. The temperature was in the high 70 Dagrees.
- 7. No meteorological or other solar disturbances have been accounted for at that time.
  - 8. No physical evidence exists.
- . 9. No interception or identification action was taken due to the delay in receipt of report.
- 10. On 18 June 1952 our Jet aircraft were flying local and camera gunnery missions. Source has stated that he saw two Jets to the South-South-Rest at the same time of sighting.
