

DALE YOUTH SEES FLYING 'SOMETHING'

Dale, Ind. A Spencer County youth told police Sunday night he was held frozen in his tracks as he watched a glowing object cavort in the backyard and then streak away.

Puzzled authorities found a burned spot in the grass about the size of a dinner plate but said they had no idea what the object might have been.

Charles Englebrecht, 18, Dale, said he was alone in the darkened home watching television when a bright flash of light beside a window attracted his attention.

Englebrecht said the television and the lights in an adjoining room then blacked out. He is the son of Mr. & Mrs. Gilbert Englebrecht. Their farm is two miles west of here.

Trough overturned.

Englebrecht said the thing already was on the ground near the back steps when he got outside, but said "some strange power" held him away from it.

He noticed a nearby chicken feeded trough had been overturned, a large can of chicken feed knocked from a table and the family power mower was 10 feet from where he left it.

"I was numb," he said. "I didn't know what to do."

The boy said as he watched unable to move, "It began to rise and then disappeared over the barn."

A smell of sulphur filled the air, he said.

Dale Town Marshall Leroy Musgrave said he phoned State Police but received no other reports as the incident.

The boys mother said she and her husband had seen a similar light last Wednesday but thought it was a falling star.

Englebrecht is a 1964 graduate of Dale High School and works at Huntingburg.

SIGHTING INVESTIGATION

Activity Log: .

15 June 1964. The article that appeared in the Evansville Courier that morning described the incident very well. No immediate action was taken by our unit, (Indiana Unit No.1, NICAP) at the time.

18 June 1964. Letter from NICAP asking us to investigate the case. Landing reports were continuing and this was the 15th case received since 24 April.

20 June 1964. A team of three FI's of NICAP's Indiana Unit No. 1

went to Dale to get a first-hand report and soil samples. With the exception of the completed Form 97 (unsigned) and sketch of the indentations (which we did not obtain a copy of, and NICAP has the only copies) everything else is presented here.

21 June 1964. I ascertained the position of the moon for that evening as 150-degrees (almost SE+). Object's position was later determined to be at 261 to 241 (almost due West and SWW).

22 June 1964. Letter and samples sent to NICAP HQ.

7 July 1964. Another trip to Dale to check radiation levels at site. They were the same and too low to be concerned with.

11 July 1964. We obtained a signed Form 164B to document the case. Mr. Englebrecht did not want Charles to sign anything earlier. NICAP wanted a Form 97 signed and completed.

16 July 1964. Letter from NICAP acknowledging receipt of samples. A top-ranking government scientist was to conduct the analysis.

- Where were you and what were you doing at the time?
 In the house watching television.
- What made you first notice the object?Strange light on outside that shouldn't have been there.
- What did you think the object was when you first noticed it?
 Didn't know.
- 4. Describe your reactions and actions, during and after the sighting?
 He claimed that a prickling sensation or shock-like force prevented him from approaching the object. The time period of 5-minutes for the observation may therefore be a little exaggerated, or may not.
- 5. Describe the object and its actions.

 Object, sharply defined, self-luminous, actual size approximating that of a regular basketball, landed on the ground right near witness. After about 5-minutes the object took off off the barn (40° away). Object went from a bright red to a bluish-purple to white to brighter red on departure.
- How did you lose sight of the object?Object soared over barn and out of sight. Vanished in the distance.

FURTHER INVESTIGATION

Additional Witness Check:

Vera Hartley, Grace Kissel, Walter Singer & Mr. & Mrs. Engelbrecht all say they saw the glow "of something", but did not actually see the object.

Witness Background Check:

Our opinion was that, the boy had a real experience with something unusual. He had lost a lot of weight (not sure now how much) through loss of appetite and diarreha after the event.

SPECIAL EVIDENCE

Again, the MUFON Forms were not available in 1964 and were just recently completed by this investigator.

- 1) Originally there was a scorch mark about the size of a paper plate, still smouldering after the takeoff. There was some oily residue on the grass blades upon our arrival several days later.
- 2) The indentations were mapped and sketched and turned into NICAP. Unfortunately, no copy had been made. However, there were three small, 1" deep (finger-diameter) indentations in the small dinnerplate-sized area forming a triangle. The distances were 2" by 4-1/4" by 4-1/4". A lot of weight appeared to have been exerted to produce this small effect.
- 3) The witness described the feeling as he came out the back door to see the object as a "prickling sensation" that held him back as sure as if he had hit a clothesline. This was total paralysis, but centered about midchest on down about a fist wide. There was no clothesline there! We checked.
- 4) Charles had been near shock and experienced loss of appetite and loss of considerable weight during the next two weeks. I believe he lost about 18 pounds, but I cannot find any records to this effect. This loss of weight was also due to diarreha.
- 5) TV interference and a power failure during the event sound familiar.
- 6) Objects such as a lawn mower, chicken feeder and a hoe were displaced, actually pulled toward the spot where the object rested. The mower, 10°. Garden hoe, 50°.
- 7) On the first day we visited we used two radiation detection units, one a V-700 geiger counter and the other, a Model 117B

scintillator. Both gave the same readings. A reading of 0.02 mr/h is not any consequence.

- 8) The reported smell of sulphur over the area is suspicious and has been reported in the literature many times.
- 9) The cherry trees and garden plants exposed near the area later died.

William T. Powers, the chief systems engineer at Dearborn Observatory had investigated the case for Project Blue Book and stated that he thought the boy may have seen only a burning piece of paper. I do not have the date(s) he visited, but it was prior to our investigation. I never heard the final analyses by the Air Force. Maybe CUFOS has a record from Dr. Hyneks efforts since he and Mr. Powers were associates.

Later we found that we had not submitted enough material or large enough samples to obtain an analyses. There simply wasn't enough residue. We did not obtain plaster casts of the indentations.

SIGHTING EVALUATION:

Final report by State Director as follows:

Over twenty years have passed since this event occurred and we have seen a lot of reports in that area of the state of orange (and some red) objects meeting that description and size. The brightness, duration, takeoff and EM effects appear to place it in one of three categories:

- 1) Ball lightning-ruled out.
- 2) Persinger lights- ruled out.
- Possible "probe" associated with the UFO phenomenon. There
 had been several landings that year, beginning with the
 Socorro case.

There was no reason to doubt this boy's credibility that we could find.



tronomer at Northwestern University is investigating Warrick County's bouncing barhyard glow but thinks the results will not be startling a piece of burning paper, astronomer William Powers of the Destroom. Observatory said yesterday as he took samples of earth and grass to make some tests. A circle of scorthed grass the size of a dinner plate was the main evidence.

Dear Mr. Hall:

Enclosed are various specimens gathered from the farm of Clarence Englebrecht located on State Highway 68, 2 miles west of Dale, Indiana. These specimens were taken from an area in proximity where a UFO reportedly landed on June 14, 1964 at (9:00 P.M.) 2100 hous M.T. The enclosed samples were gathered on June 20 and have been under refrigeration since June 21 to mailing date. Please send us a full report of the analyses of these samples regardless of their nature or significance to the case in question. We must have this so that we can correlate this to additional information we now have and are now obtaining.

We will be returning to Dale on June 27 to carry our investigation further. We have received more reports on the same sighting and others. Should any additional samples be desired or instruction be issued please contact us prior to this date. A full written report, taped interview and photographs will be sent as soon as we can reasonably assume the investigation to be complete.

Below are sample-numbers and a brief explanation:

1 and 2 are blades of grass taken from an area no less than 2^n to 3^n from the edge of the landing spot. Oil smears of some sort were noticed on these after the sighting.

3 is a soil sample taken from the very center of the landing spot. At time of gathering, rain and wind had already removed most of the remains or ashes. The ground was not seen after but smoldered 1 to 2 minutes after departure.


h is a leaf from a cherry tree 12' from landing spot.

5 and 6 are soil samples taken from 2' and 10' north of landing spot.

7 is a grass sample taken 52' h from landing spot. This is where Charles Englebrecht stood unable to move forward do to a strong electrical force exerting itself on the front portion of his body. Area covered by this force was about a hands width from head to toe...much like being shocked by a small electrical charge.

After the sighting a strong odor much like sulfur or carbolic acid dominated the area of the sighting and a $\frac{1}{4}$ mile to the south of it. The Englebrechts also noted that the water from their cistern was very odorous and distasteful for no apparent reason. New developments are turning up constantly and all indications of the sighting look very good.



Subject SUBSEQUENT INTERROGATIONS AND RADIATION CHECKS IN REFERENCE TO DALE CASE 55.

On this date at approximately 7:00 we rechecked the landing site for a radiation reading taken on 20 June. The reading then was 0.02 mr/hr in clearer weather and dryer conditions, although the weather was stormer on the actual sighting date.

These radiation checks with the geiger counter and scintillator showed the same reading. This indicates that the reading is normal for the area. On this date (7 Jul) the weather conditions were stormy with a very active electrical storm center. This increase in precip did not seem to contribute any fallout to throw off the readings. If the reading had been appreciable different from the Aune 20th readings, then there might be more speculation as to causes. As far as radiation from the object is concerned, I could not find any reason to assume any such evidence from what I detected.

The reading at the time of the sighting might have shown something. Radioactive decay is very fast and by the 20th would probably have dropped to the background level.

William Powers was supposed to have commented that as far as the "force-field" was concerned around the object if the boy had walked further toward the repulsive force he would have been pulled toward it. This, of course could not be substantiated.

C.P. activities have been detected in the area do to publicity. This has no bearing on the case itself, it only tends to increase the paperwork.

Do to the health of the boy because of the scare from the sighting we let him fill out our Form 164 at his leisure. We already had a 97 filled out as per our OTS investigation on 20 June.



Dear Francis:

Can you rush me a brief account of the June 14 Dale case giving the basic facts for inclusion in the UFO Investigator? We are trying to quickly get out an issue with a round-up of the many recent cases, especially landing reports. Mainly what we need is time, kxxxxxxx whysical xeres brief description of the incident as described by the witness, any supporting testimony, and a few comments about your estimate of his reliability.

The samples were safely received and I have spoken to. a top-rank government scientist about them, aw well as a few other samples we have from elsewhere. This man will do an excellent job of analysis, if such is possible. But we will be unable to identify him or his organization unless something spectacular is contained in the evidence. However. we can be assured of a fair and extremely thorough analysis: he has fantastic equipment at his disposal, and is willing to use it in our behalf on an off-the-record basis. Otherwise, he could not justify the use of the equipment to his agency.

I don't think this next report came from you. If not. could you do a little checking for us? Mrs. Helen Reed, RR#2, Lawrenceville, Illinois(2 1/2 miles W of Lawrence-ville just off U.S. 50) had a spectacular close-range sighting 9:30 p.m. June 8. It was a dome-shaped UFO which maneuvered very low to the ground and within about 50 feet of her. We have a signed report, but would like to know what sort of a person she is.

The main mission would be character amalysis, but this could be done under the pretext of obtaining more details. In fact, we could use a carefully drawn map of the area showing the positions of the UFO in relation to trees and other landmarks (which she omitted from her otherwise good map). Dear Mr. Hall:

This is in reply to your letter of 15 July. Included with this letter is a NICAP form that was used for investigation. We were unable to obtain any written or signed statements. The boy's parents wouldn't permit it. In this case the only thing to do is certify the report until we do get a signed statement or signature on the report.

I have included other data on the Dale report to aid in the investigation and research of the soil and grass samples. A further check on the 7th of July (two weeks after we first investigated) down at Dale showed the same radiation reading of 0.02 mr/hr. This shows that the reading we took on the 20th of June was normal for the area (high only for this area).

We were investigating a car chase reported to the Englebrecht boy, on the 7th of July. We have a taped interview. It happened on June 17th at Chrisney, 10 miles south of Dale. We are still working on this and the Dale report.

We are wandering about the reported landing of a UPO near Rome. Indiana last month. Still checking.

We will begin investigation of Lawrenceville report as soon as possible.

We did not receive all the copies of the UFO Evidence. We have received orders from the US Army to report for six months active duty for the National Guard. Two of us are involved. We leave August the oth. Please rush us the rest of the reports. We will do all we can until we leave and will also do what we can to insure operation of this unit while we are gone.

STRANGE EFFECTS FROM U.FOS NICAP SPECIAL REPORT, 1969

The snow in the area was blown around and some of the bushes were flattened.

Springhill is about 125 miles northeast of Cornwallis.

Fifty four of the sightings in this report include landings or near landings from 1954 to 1969 in 20 states and eight foreign countries. Of these, 31, or more than half, involve the discovery of physical evidence. Twenty-seven, or exactly half, include animal reactions. Of these, five involve reactions from more than one kind of animal.

Landing/Communication Theories

The landing and hear landing cases are of special significance, particularly if we consider the tremendous success of our Apollo program and man's walk on the moon. President Richard M. Nixon has predicted that, by the end of the century, we will have explored other planets and come in contact with some form of life. This has prompted some skeptics to the extraterrestrial theory of OFOs to take a second look and ask the vital question: if we can land and walk on an extraterrestrial body, is it, not possible that members of some extraterrestrial civilization could do the same to earth? Most astronomers now believe that there is life, intelligent and otherwise, on millions of other planets. Even the noted UFO skeptic, astronomer Dr. Carl Sagan, of Princeton University, has said that, if there are extraterrestrial civilizations somewhere in space, many are probably more highly developed, at least scientifically, than the human race.

This, of course; still does not answer the frequently-asked question: if extraterrestrial beings have landed here on earth, why have they not established contact? We cannot answer this question. Nor will we be able to do so until actual contact is made. (Thus far, NICAP has not found a single authenticated report of verbal or physical contact between a human and an extraterrestrial being, the reports of certain questionable individuals and fringe groups to the contrary). However; we can offer some educational speculation.

One interesting 'theory is that the beings who possibly man UFOs are so different from us in physiological and psychological makeup that they may look upon us as we look upon the lower forms of animals. "After all," Dr. James E. McDonald said, "we don't try to communicate with the kangaroo in Australia." In dealing with this problem we may be forced to alter our "human" way of reasoning, as difficult as it may be. Dr. Frank Halsted, the late astronomer, said that we too often tend to judge conditions in the universe by conditions here on earth.

There have been a few reports of alleged extraterrestrial beings beside landed UFOs who appeared to be studying the terrain and collecting earth samples. Although of questionable documentation, this is certainly no longer as far-fetched as it once was. The collecting of moon rocks by our own astronauts may be cited as a good back-up.

Witness Shocked, Yard Utensils Disturbed

Charles Englebrecht was watching television in his home in Dale, Indiana, at 8:55 p.m., June 14, 1964, when he saw a light pass by the kitchen window. As he went to investigate, the television set and house lights went out.

Outside, the witness saw an orange object as large as a basketball resting on the ground in the back yard. As he attempted a closer approach, Englebrecht said be felt something pressing him back or his frightened state may have induced this sensation. A NICAP Vincennes, Indiana, Subcommittee investigator said the sensation was "much like being shocked by a small electrical charge."

Calling his parents, the witness saw the UFO take off and move to the west over the barn roof.

Englebrecht and his parents noticed a strong "sulfurous" smell around the area where the object had landed. This was confirmed about half an hour later when Police Chief Leroy Musgrave arrived to investigate. Musgrave said he noted the odor "at least ½ mile from the house."

There were other things out of order in the yard. A power fawn mower had apparently rolled about 10 feet from its normal place toward the landing site. Cans that were on a table had fallen off in the same direction. A hoe was located 50 feet away from its stand against the house, It, too, was near the landing site. A water trough had been overturned, according to a local newspaper account. There was also a small burned area with three indentations forming a triangle and measuring nearly an inch in depth and diameter.(21)

In a telephone interview with Dr. James E. McDonald, Mrs. Gilbert Englebrecht, the witness' mother, said her son lost weight in the weeks following the sighting and he did not feel his normal self until the end of the summer. She added that all the cherry trees and garden plants around the landing area died after the sighting. She also confirmed the permeating odor and the E-M effects.

Object Leaves Circle, Disturbed Leaves

Mrs. Thelma B. Schumaker was visiting her mother, Mrs. W. H. Blackburn, five miles north of Airy, North Carolina, Both were asleep at 3 a.m., August 19, 1965. Suddenly, Mrs. Schumaker was awakened by an "explosive" noise in the back yard.

"The noise was nearing the north side of the house and by my window," the witness told NICAP. "It had changed to . . . that of a giant top spinning. It sounded as though air currents were inside metal and extremely powerful. I could feel them against the house and could hear the timbs of an evergreen seemingly being almost pulled from it. This tree was possibly 12 feet from my window. I must admit I was frightened by this time, as I thought it would surely hit the house."

Mrs. Schumaker thought she had been struck by an "immobilizing power," for she could neither "move or speak." Then the noise appeared to rise and travel west. The frightened woman woke her mother. Both women saw a bright golden cigar hovering to the north. The UFO then moved to the right, then left, then up and down, left again, then disappeared behind some high oak trees.

The next morning the witnesses found, in the back yard, a "six inch wide circle of depressed sod" that was, in places, "worn to the soil." The circle was £2 feet in diameter. There were strewn leaves from the oak trees. I-caves on the other trees also appeared disheveled. Mrs. Schumaker also reported a large hole on the roof of her house which had not been noticed prior to the sighting.
